



MEDICAL TREATMENT FOR YOUR FAMILY PET

- The Maxwell Veterinary Treatment Facility has a primary mission of providing preventive veterinary care to Military Working Dogs and privately owned animals. It is part of Maxwell Veterinary Treatment Facility mission to provide Level I veterinary care to the surrounding community of Maxwell and Gunter Air Force Base. We are located behind the AAFES PX/BX and in the same building as the Furniture Store and Dry Cleaners on Arnold Street. Maxwell Veterinary Treatment Facility provides basic health care for family pets of active duty, retired service members, and Reservist and National Guard serving on active duty. If you are a Reservist or National Guardsmen you can make an appointment to have your animal seen at the Maxwell Veterinary Treatment Facility during your annual two weeks of active military service.
- Services provided include, but are not limited to, routine vaccinations, test for internal and external parasites, full line of flea products, heartworm testing and preventatives, health certificates, and treatment of diseases that may be transmitted from animals to humans. We are not authorized to provide any grooming or boarding kennels services.
- All pets should be registered with the Maxwell Veterinary Treatment Facility within 10 days of purchase or arrival on Maxwell or Gunter installations. All veterinary services are by appointment only; emergency services are not available at this facility after hours or weekends. It is recommended that all pets be microchipped for identification purposes.
- If you have a family pet now or plan on getting one in the future, you should, at a minimum, ensure your animal is provided with the following preventive health measures.
- **ADULT DOGS** annual vaccinations should include Distemper, Parvovirus, Hepatitis, Leptospirosis, Parainfluenza, and Corona Virus. Rabies vaccinations are required for all dogs. Additionally, if you plan on boarding your animal anytime within the next 6 months it's recommended to have them vaccinated against canine kennel cough, which we provide, upon request. We also recommend that all dogs be kept on heartworm preventative all year round.
- **ADULT CATS** annual vaccinations should include Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, and Panleukopenia. Rabies vaccinations are required for all cats. Additionally, cats can be vaccinated for the Feline Leukemia Virus, upon request.
- **PUPPIES and KITTENS** should start their vaccinations at 6-8 weeks of age and receive their first Rabies vaccination when they are between three to four months old. We recommend deworming all puppies and kittens during their first two visits.
- **The hours of the Maxwell Veterinary Treatment Facility are as follows:**

Closed the last working day of every month for inventory at 12pm
Closed Weekends, Holidays, and Training Holidays
