Maxwell AFB Chapel: Partner with Bridges Of Faith (BOF)

From Orphanage Bible Camps to Church Planting in remote village to incubating adoptions to helping graduating orphans, Bridges of Faith (BOF) offers short-term answers and long-term solutions to Ukraine. BOF also operates a 140 acre retreat center just 30 miles north of Maxwell AFB for church groups, civic groups, and orphans. BOF offers volunteer opportunities - hands on - with international orphans and all kinds of work projects on campus.

There are over 100,000 orphans in Ukraine. When we think of orphans we think of children with no living parents and that is the case with some of these orphans. Many of them are social orphans; that is they still have a parent living. The unfortunate reality is that these children have been given up, abandoned. They have no parent willing to call them son or daughter anymore and are wards of the state. BOF is slated to receive 12 orphans NLT 12 May 11...there is plenty of work to be done at the camp!

Shuffle furniture between buildings – Dever House, the Cottage, the Office, and Centerpoint.
